"Obedience isn't just for children," Jesse said. "God, our heavenly Father, still wants the best for us as adults."

God's commands aren't burdens—they're invitations to blessing. When we obey from the heart, we live in freedom, fruitfulness, and fellowship with our Father.

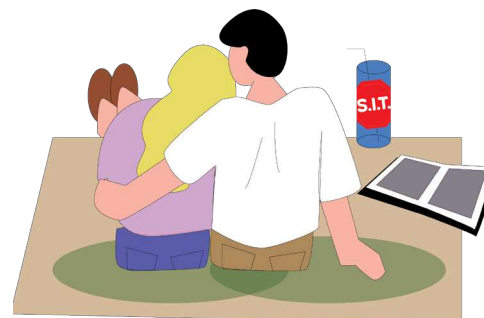
to make the unity," she said, "but we are instructed to guard it."
