Saturday morning continued the "God Our Father" series by opening our eyes to His elevated vision and inviting us to make it our own. Joseph Latta began with "God's Viewpoint," urging us to trade our limited perspective for our Father's unlimited one. "God has a vision for each of us," he said. "By going to the Word, we can make His vision our vision." Drawing from Ephesians and Romans, Joseph reminded us that we've been chosen, justified, and made righteous—not just when things are

going well, but in the very midst of challenging circumstances. Using vivid imagery of an eagle soaring above the terrain, he illustrated how God sees the big picture and equips us to live it. "We're athletes of the spirit, witnesses of the truth, ambassadors for Christ, and sons of God with power."

Lori Stanbridge followed with "Staking Your Claim." Referencing the California gold rush, she explained that staking a claim means declaring, "This belongs to me." We can stake our claim in the Word we've been

given, in the truth that God made us His sons, in the gift of holy spirit, in our function as members in particular, and in our ministry as ambassadors for Christ. The gold the miners found in California was limited, but as Lori reminded us, "the spiritual riches that come from God are unlimited." Those riches belong to us!

Way Productions topped off the morning with "What's True About You," bringing notes of joy to a celebration of clarity and bold believing.

Today, make God's vision for your life your vision, and boldly declare what belongs to you: "I am who God says I am. I stake my claim!"
